WHO WE ARE

EUSTORY is an informal network of non-governmental organisations. Those organisations conduct historical research competitions for young people in Europe, promote research-based historical project work among young Europeans and encourage them to develop their own understanding of the European past and present. Initiated by the Körber Foundation in 2001, the EUSTORY network has its coordination office in Hamburg, Germany.

WHAT WE WANT

To maintain peace and prosperity in the globalized world of the 21st Century, Europe needs a young generation of responsible citizens with a clear awareness of Europe's past and the historical-political patterns of European citizenship. EUSTORY offers young Europeans the opportunity to critically examine their personal or local history, to openly discuss different interpretations of the past and to present and develop an awareness of European identity. During international EUSTORY seminars and meetings, young people from all over Europe come together to actively explore issues of European relevance and learn to understand differences.

WHAT WE DO AND HOW TO JOIN US

EUSTORY operates on the national and on the European level. On the national level the network members independently organise competitions and projects for young people. Students, teachers and experts who are interested in getting involved are invited to contact their national EUSTORY member organisation. On the European level, the Körber Foundation coordinates the network and its international activities. Non-governmental organisations and institutions active in the field of history, citizenship and youth are welcome to contact the EUSTORY office in Hamburg for possible cooperation.
